

OPEN WATER SWIMMING

QUALIFICATION SYSTEM

Only NOCs recognized by Centro Caribe Sports (CCS), whose national federations are members of World Aquatics (AQUA) and PanAm Aquatics (PAQ) may register athletes in the Open Water Swimming competitions of the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026.

CALLED EVENTS

- 1. 10 kilometers men
- 2. 10 kilometers women
- 3. Sprint Knock-out men
- 4. Sprint Knock-out women

QUALIFYING EVENT

- All CCS member countries and those from PAQ Zones II and III are eligible to participate. Associate members recognized by Centro Caribe Sports (CCS) are also eligible to participate, provided they have qualified through the qualification system established by PAQ.
- Qualification for the Games will be obtained at a qualifying event in March 2026 (to be confirmed). Places will be awarded to National Olympic Committees (NOCs), not to individual athletes.
- Each national federation may be represented by a maximum of two athletes per gender in the individual qualifying events.
- First priority for qualification: Two (2) places per gender will be awarded to the host country, the Dominican Republic.
- Vacancies that may occur due to illness, withdrawal, incapacity due to a doping test, sanctions, or any other anomaly will be filled based on the ranking of places obtained at the qualifying event.
- If the assigned places are not filled, PAQ reserves the right to make the reassignment in common agreement with CCS.

ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

To participate in the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026, athletes must accept the provisions of the Games regulations, the PAQ rules, and the AQUA rules. They must also be registered by their NOC in accordance with the CCS statutes.

Athletes participating in Santo Domingo 2026 must have the nationality of the NOC that registered them. Nationality is determined in accordance with the CCS regulations. Athletes must be fourteen (14) years of age as of December 31, 2026 (born in 2012 or earlier).

CONFIRMATION OF QUOTA PLACES

PAQ shall confirm to CCS and the NOCs the places obtained no later than 31 March 2026. No later than 10 April 2026, the NOCs shall confirm to CCS and PAQ the places they will occupy.

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

If necessary, PAQ will reallocate the quotas to the next highest-ranked NOC in the corresponding event. This process must be completed by April 24, 2026. NOCs receiving reallocated quotas must confirm their participation to CSS and PAQ by May 1, 2026.

QUALIFICATION FOR THE 2027 LIMA PANAMERICAN GAMES

The top two athletes in Zone PAQ II and Zone PAQ III in the women's 10 km events will be awarded direct qualification spots for their respective National Olympic Committees for the Lima 2027 Pan American Games.

SWIMMING

QUALIFICATION SYSTEM

The Dominican Republic, as the host country, is automatically qualified for all swimming events at the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026, with a maximum of twenty (20) athletes: up to two (2) athletes for each individual event and one team for each relay event.

- a. Each NOC has the automatic participation of four (4) athletes, two of each gender.
- b. Each NOC may register up to a maximum of ten (10) female athletes and ten (10) male athletes, for a maximum of 20 athletes. Failure to fill the quota for one gender will not allow it to be used for the other gender.
- c. In each individual event, each NOC may register a maximum of two (2) athletes.
- d. In each relay event, each NOC may register a maximum of one (1) team.
- e. No timed entries ("NT") will not be permitted.

The Organizing Committee of the Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026 (COSADO 2026) and the ITD will send the official forms for the long list and nominal registration on April 30, 2026. They will also be available on the Games website. They will also send the competition file in the Team Manager program.

COSADO 2026 and the ITD will notify each NOC of the names of the swimmers who qualified for the Games no later than May 15, 2026.

NOCs will have until May 22, 2026, to confirm their attendance at COSADO 2026 and the ITD.

ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

For this event the minimum age will be fourteen (14) years old by December 31, 2026, as long as they have been nominated by their National Olympic Committee and National Federation.

CONFIRMATION OF QUOTA PLACES

NOCs will have until April 30, 2026, to email the final nominal entries to the International Technical Delegate, including proof of where the times were recorded ("Proof of Time").

The "Proof of Time" report must be sent in PDF format to the following email addresses: santodomingo2026@panamaquatics.com and swimming@panamaquatics.com, addressed to Andrea Pineda, International Technical Delegate (ITD). The ITD, along with COSADO 2026 and the Centro Caribe Sports Technical Commission, will evaluate the final entries.

If the total number of athletes in the nominal entries submitted by the NOCs does not exceed 200, all registered athletes will qualify for Santo Domingo 2026.

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

If the total number of athletes in the nominal entries submitted by the NOCs is greater than 200 athletes, PAQ will use the World Aquatics points table to achieve a quota of no more than 200 athletes, and that comply with the concept of "universality" where a NOC will be entitled to have at least one athlete per gender.

ARTISTIC SWIMMING

QUALIFICATION SYSTEM

As the host, the Dominican Republic qualifies with a full team of nine athletes, with a maximum of two male athletes, and may participate in each event.

For the Artistic Swimming qualifying event, expected to take place in 2025 or early 2026, the following criteria will apply:

- 1. Teams and Acrobatic Routine: The four (4) highest-ranked NOCs based on the sum of the technical, freestyle, and acrobatic routine scores from the team events will qualify for Santo Domingo 2026.
- **2. Women's Duets:** The three (3) highest-ranked NOCs based on the sum of the technical and freestyle routine scores whose teams have not qualified will qualify for Santo Domingo 2026.
- **3. Mixed Duets:** The four (4) highest-ranked NOCs based on the sum of the technical and freestyle routine scores whose teams have not qualified will qualify for Santo Domingo 2026.

QUOTAS

The distribution of the 60 spots is as follows:

- Host NOC (including up to two male athletes): 9 athletes.
- The top 4 NOCs from the team qualifying event: 36 athletes.
- The top 3 NOCs from the women's duet qualifying event that did not qualify from the team event: 6 female athletes.
- The top 4 NOCs from the mixed duet qualifying event that did not qualify from the team event: 4 men and 4 women.

If a quota is available, it may be allocated to the highest-ranked mixed and women's duets in the qualifying event whose teams have not qualified.

ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

To participate in the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026, athletes must accept the provisions of the Games regulations, the PAQ rules, and the AQUA rules. In addition, they must be registered by their NOC in accordance with the CCS statutes.

Athletes participating in Santo Domingo 2026 must have the nationality of the NOC that registered them. Nationality is determined in accordance with the CCS regulations. Athletes must be fifteen (15) years old as of December 31, 2026 (born in 2011 or earlier).

CONFIRMATION OF QUOTA PLACES

PAQ shall confirm to CCS and the NOCs the places obtained no later than 31 March 2026. No later than 10 April 2026, the NOCs shall confirm to CCS and PAQ the places they will occupy.

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

In the event of a vacancy due to withdrawal or disqualification due to injury, doping, sanctions, or other reasons, the quotas will be filled by the next highest-ranked NOC in the respective event.

If there are no more NOCs to allocate team quotas, the vacant quotas will be filled with mixed duets and/or women's duets (two athletes), up to the maximum quota of 60 athletes.

If necessary, PAQ will reallocate the quotas to the next highest-ranked NOC in the corresponding event. This process must be completed by April 24, 2026. NOCs that receive reallocated quotas must confirm their participation to CSS and PAQ by May 1, 2026.

DIVING

QUALIFICATION SYSTEM

As the host country, the Dominican Republic will automatically qualify one (1) athlete per individual event and one team per synchronized diving event for the Diving competition in Santo Domingo 2026.

Each NOC may register a maximum of ten (10) divers, five (5) women and five (5) men, provided they have synchronized diving teams. If they do not have a synchronized diving team, each NOC may register up to a maximum of six (6) divers, three (3) women and three (3) men, for individual events.

ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

The Diving competition for the 2026 Central American and Caribbean Games will be held at the Centro Olimpico Juan Pablo Duarte (COJPD). To participate in the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026, athletes must accept the provisions of the Games regulations, the PAQ rules, and the AQUA rules. In addition, they must be registered by their NOC in accordance with the CCS statutes.

For an event to be considered official, at least five (5) athletes must participate in the individual events and at least five (5) pairs must participate in the synchronized events of the National Olympic Committees.

The CCS will resolve cases in which one or more teams, after the technical meeting, are unable to participate due to reasons of force majeure, corroborated and verified by the CCS.

The combination of athletes from different countries will not be permitted for the events and events scheduled for the Santo Domingo 2026 Central American and Caribbean Games.

Athletes participating in Santo Domingo 2026 must have the nationality of the NOC that registered them. Nationality is determined in accordance with the CCS regulations. Athletes must be fourteen (14) years of age as of December 31, 2026 (born in 2012 or earlier).

CONFIRMATION OF QUOTA PLACES

PAQ will confirm the quota places obtained to CCS and the NOCs by March 31, 2026, at the latest. NOCs must confirm the quota places they will occupy to CCS and PAQ by April 10, 2026, at the latest.

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

In the event of a vacancy due to withdrawal or disqualification due to injury, doping, sanctions, or other reasons, quotas will be filled by invitation, respecting the maximum possible number for each NOC.

WATER POLO

QUALIFICATION SYSTEM

Women's: Six (6) teams will qualify for Santo Domingo 2026 as follows:

- 1. The Dominican Republic will automatically qualify as the host country.
- 2. The remaining five (5) teams will be those placed 1st to 5th in the qualifying event to be held in late 2025 or early 2026.

Men's: Eight (8) teams will qualify for Santo Domingo 2026 as follows:

- 1. The Dominican Republic will automatically qualify as the host country.
- 2. The remaining seven (7) teams will be those placed 1st to 7th in the qualifying event to be held in late 2025 or early 2026.

QUOTAS

According to the latest update to the AQUA Water Polo regulations, in section 6, paragraph 2 (team composition), article 2.1: each team will be made up of a maximum of 12 players and 2 goalkeepers.

ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

To participate in the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026, athletes must accept the provisions of the Games regulations, the PAQ rules, and the AQUA rules. In addition, they must be registered by their NOC in accordance with the CCS bylaws.

Minimum Participation

For an event or competition to be considered official, five (5) teams and an equal number of NOCs must participate. If one or more NOCs, after the technical meeting, are unable to participate due to force majeure, corroborated and verified by CCS, which is the sole authority to authorize the event, the CCS will decide.

Nationality

Athletes participating in Santo Domingo 2026 must have the nationality of the NOC that registered them. Nationality is determined in accordance with CCS regulations.

Minimum Age of Athletes

All participating athletes must be at least 16 years of age by December 31, 2026.

CONFIRMATION OF QUOTA PLACES

PAQ shall confirm the places obtained to CCS and the NOCs no later than 31 March 2026. No later than 10 April 2026, the NOCs shall confirm to CCS and PAQ the places they will occupy.

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

If a team renounces its place, PAQ will carry out the reassignment in agreement with CCS.

16 teams will participate in the Women's Category (1 team from the host country and 15 teams previously classified in a hybrid tournament with a game pace of Fifteen (15) minutes with an increment of Ten (10) seconds per play from the first play, per player) and 16 teams will participate in the Men's Category (1 team from the host country and 15 teams previously classified in a hybrid tournament with a game pace of Fifteen (15) minutes with an increment of Ten (10) seconds per play from the first play, per player).

ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

To participate in the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026, athletes must comply with the provisions of the Games Regulations, the rules of the Confederation of Chess for the Americas (CCA), and the rules of the International Chess Federation (FIDE). They must also be registered by their National Olympic Committee (NOC) in accordance with the Statutes of Centro Caribe Sports (CCS).

CONFIRMATION OF QUOTA PLACES

The Qualifying Tournaments for the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games 2026 will be held in hybrid mode through the Tournament platform from January 17 to 18, 2026, in accordance with the FIDE Online Chess Regulations. The top 15 countries in each tournament will qualify for the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games 2026. If any country does not confirm its participation by April 4, 2026, it will be replaced by the next highest ranked country in the ranking table.

REALLOCATION OF QUOTA PLACES

The 15 countries qualified in the senior and 15 countries qualified in the women's divisions in hybrid tournaments must confirm their participation by April 4, 2026.

Should any of them not confirm, they will be substituted by the next highest ranked team from January 17–18, 2026.

INDIVIDUAL EVENTS

Each National Olympic Committee (NOC) qualifies in each individual event may participate with a maximum of two athletes.

- a. For the maximum quota of competitors per individual event, the top positions according to the Central American and Caribbean rankings will be taken into account. These rankings must be carried out on the established dates until the maximum quota is reached.
- b. The **World Athletics** event rankings will be used as a reference.

RELAY EVENTS

For the men's and women's 4x100m and 4x400m relays, as well as the mixed 4x400m relay, the national teams will be qualified as follows:

- a. The 4 (four) members of each relay team, with a maximum of 6 (six) athletes (4x100m, 4x400m, and 4x400m mixed), must be classified and registered in an individual event.
- b. Each NOC may register up to a maximum of 2 (two) competitors participating in each relay race. In the case of the 4x400m mixed relay, 1 woman and 1 man must be registered.

UNIVERSALITY PLACES

The principles of universality, parity, and equity will be observed. All NOCs have the right to register at least one (1) man and one (1) woman in any event, taking into account the following aspects:

- a. NOCs must propose to the Organizing Committee the male and/or female athlete who occupies the highest position in the world rankings as of the closing date for applications. Events longer than 1,500 meters, as well as Combined Events, are not eligible for university places.
- b. The Technical Delegates will decide whether to accept such registration and will have the power to determine the event and/or athlete who will be eligible to participate in the Games based on the criterion of universal classification
- c.NOCs must submit their applications for universality places no later than June 7, 2026, to the following email addresses: mserralta.nacac@gmail.com, cvwjl@hotmail.coml.com, jurogol4@gmail.com, inscripciones@jcc2026.com.
- d. This application must include the names of the athletes, their event, and their performance.

HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The Dominican Republic will automatically qualify with one (1) athlete for all Athletics events where it does not have qualified athletes, as it is the host country of the Central American and Caribbean Games, Santo Domingo 2026. The following aspects must be observed:

- a. If two places are required in an event, both athletes must be qualified in the ranking.
- b. The Dominican Republic will determine the qualification system for its athletes for this competition.

ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

Only NOCs recognized by Centro Caribe Sport, whose National Athletics Federations are affiliated with WA/NACAC/South American Athletics, may register competitors for the Central American and Caribbean Games, Santo Domingo 2026.

- a. Athletes must have signed and submitted the athlete eligibility form.
- b. NOCs must consider the following age aspects for participants:
 - Athletes aged 18 or 19 on December 31, 2026 (i.e., born in 2007 or 2008) may compete in any event except the Half Marathon and 42.195 km Marathon and Walk events.
 - Athletes aged 16 or 17 on December 31, 2026 (i.e., born in 2009 or 2010) may compete in any event except the Throws, Combined Events, 10,000 meters, Half Marathon, and the 21.098 km and 42.195 km Walk events.
 - No athlete under 16 years of age on December 31, 2026 (i.e., born in 2011 or later) may register

QUALIFICATION PERIOD

The **World Athletics** event ranking system will be used as a reference for the qualification system. The established dates are as follows:

- a. For the Half Marathon, Race Walking, Combined Events, and 10,000 meters, participants may participate between January 1, 2025, and June 6, 2026.
- b. For the remaining events, the established dates are from July 1, 2025, to June 2026.

VALIDEZ DE LOS RESULTADOS

a. Results must be achieved during competitions organized or sanctioned by World Athletics, its Area Associations (NACAC/South American Athletics), or member federations and conducted in accordance with the rules of World Athletics and by which they are held (beginning January 1, 2025).

- b. Results obtained in school or university competitions must be certified by the Member Federation of the country in which the competition was organized, and must comply with the authorizations of World Athletics and the respective Area Association.
- c. Results obtained in mixed competitions in track events will not be accepted. Exceptionally, in accordance with Article 9 of the World Athletics Regulations, results achieved in the 5,000 and 10,000 meter events may be accepted in circumstances where there were not enough athletes of one or both genders competing to justify separate races, and there was no passing or assistance by an athlete of one gender to an athlete of the other gender. Where applicable, member federations must submit a specific request to their respective area association, providing the required documentation.
- d. Results obtained with a tailwind (greater than +2.0 m/s) will not be accepted.
- e. Manually timed results will not be accepted in the 100m, 200m, 400m, 800m, 1,500m, 100m/110m hurdles, 400m hurdles, 4x100m and 4x400m relays, and mixed 4x100m and 4x400m relays.
- f. Results from all field events held on indoor tracks, as well as races of 200m or more, will be accepted.
- g. Results from events of 200m or more obtained on oversized indoor tracks (more than 200m) will not be accepted.

From January 1, 2025, in the case of Permitted National Competitions, in addition to compliance with the above, all results must be achieved in a competition for which an application has been submitted to World Athletics in advance. The list of such competitions will be published on the Global Calendar pages of the World Athletics website.

RACE WALK

Results obtained in international race walking competitions defined in Rule 1.1 (a), (b), (c), (d), I, (f), (g), or (j) of **World Athletics** will be valid for ranking purposes, provided the following conditions are met (where applicable):

- a. The course will be measured by a WA/AIMS-approved Grade A or B international road race measurer.
- b. The measurement certificate must have been authorized no more than five years before the date of the competition.
- c. There will be a minimum of three international or area race walking judges in attendance.
- d. Results from track race walking events (20,000m and 35,000m) will be accepted.

HALF MARATHON

Only Half Marathon results that meet the following criteria will be considered valid for

participation times:

- a. The course will be measured before the race by an international Grade A or B road race measurer approved by the WA/AIMS.
- b. The measurement certificate must have been authorized no more than five years before the race date.
- c. Half marathons run in competitions held in accordance with WA Rule 1.1 a), b), c), f), and g) will not be included in the list; however, the results will be valid for Central American and Caribbean ranking purposes.

QUOTA PER EVENT

The following table shows the maximum quota per event for the Central American and Caribbean Games, considering the following variables:

Only National Olympic Committees (NOCs) recognized by Centro Caribe Sports (CCS), whose National Badminton Federations are members of the Badminton World Federation (BWF) and the Central American and Caribbean Badminton Confederation (CONCECABA), may register athletes in the Badminton competition at the Santo Domingo 2026 Central American and Caribbean Games. If recognized by CONCECABA, BWF associate members recognized by CCS may also participate.

Qualification System:

The ranking by country will be calculated by adding the points reflected in the WR lists of the highest-ranked athletes or pairs in each World Ranking list (men's singles, women's singles, men's doubles, women's doubles, and mixed doubles). The ranking corresponds to the NOC, not the athlete. Each NOC may establish its own selection system to participate in the Santo Domingo 2026 event, subject to the requirements of the BWF and CONCECABA.
- c. The ranking corresponds to the NOC, not the athlete. Each NOC may establish its own selection system to participate in the Santo Domingo 2026 event, subject to the requirements of the BWF and CONCECABA.
- d. The NOC must confirm its acceptance of the quotas in writing to Centro Caribe Sports and CONCECABA before April 24, 2026. Countries that did not receive the maximum quotas for men or women (3 or less) will reflect in the acceptance document of the assigned quotas their interest in receiving extra quotas, if available. In case of reallocation of quotas, countries that received three (3) quotas for men and three (3) quotas for women and, probably, the NOCs that received two (2) quotas for men and two (2) quotas for women, will be authorized to receive up to four (4) quotas for men and four (4) quotas for women, strictly respecting the order of the ranking by countries. This decision will be made by CONCECABA and informed to the Organizing Committee no later than April 27, 2026, so that the favored NOCs have the possibility to comply with the dates established by Centro Caribe Sports (CCS) to make the numerical and nominal registration.





If the six individual spots (37–40) cannot be filled with gymnasts from countries other than those already qualified (fewer than 14 countries participating in the 2025 Adult Pan American Championships), the spots will be redistributed starting with the 7th, 8th, and 9th ranked teams, successively adding one individual gymnast to each of them.

In order for the host NOC to receive its allocated spots, it must compete in the qualifying event for the respective event (2025 GAF and GAM Adult Pan American Championships).

CONFIRMATION OF QUOTA PLACES

- 3. The minimum age to participate will be 15 years of age in the year of the competition (born in 2011 or earlier).
- 4. The maximum number of athletes per weight division will be 10 athletes per gender (male and female).
- 5. 9 places for qualified countries and 1 place for host countries or wild cards.
- 6. Any category that does not fill the 9 places through qualification or with the host country will be filled by wild card.
- 7. The Pan American Weightlifting Federation Executive Committee, based on requests from the NOCs, will allocate places for women and other places for men, respecting the maximum quota of 6-6.
- 8. Similarly, in the case of places not used by NOCs, the Pan American Weightlifting Federation Executive Committee will allocate the vacant places.

HOST COUNTRY

QUALIFICATION PROCEDURE FOR THE 2026 CENTRAL AMERICAN AND CARIBBEAN GAMES

The Pan American Hockey Federation (PAHF) maintains the principle that all its member countries should have the opportunity to qualify for the Pan American Games through a regional tournament held during the two years immediately preceding the year of the Pan American Games.

Given that it is highly likely that there will be more than eight (8) entries for the Central American and Caribbean Games going forward, and considering that eighteen (18) PAHF member countries are also members of Centro Caribe Sports, a qualifying competition, open to all eligible countries, will be held to determine the remaining spots, except for those pre-qualified under the criteria detailed below.

The following is the official qualification procedure for the men's and women's hockey tournaments of the 2026 Central American and Caribbean Games, to be held in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic:

- 1. Host Country: Dominican Republic.
- 2. The top five (5) countries from the previous edition of the Central American and Caribbean Games. Therefore, the qualified teams for the 2023 Central American and Caribbean Games in the Dominican Republic are:
 - Men: Mexico, Trinidad and Tobago, Cuba, Barbados, Dominican Republic.
 - Women: Mexico, Cuba, Barbados, Dominican Republic, Jamaica.
- 3. The next two (2) qualified countries will be the first and second-place teams in the "2025 CAC Qualifying Event", which must be completed by December 31, 2025, on a date and venue to be determined through a bid process organized by the PAHF, if necessary.
 - •If two or fewer countries participate in the qualifying event, the confirmed country(ies) will automatically qualify for the 2026 Central American and Caribbean Games.
- 4. Additional teams qualified for the 2026 Central American and Caribbean Games, up to a total of eight (8), as well as reserve teams, will be determined based on the final ranking of the 2025 CAC Qualifying Event.
- 5. Additional teams, if necessary, will be defined based on the FIH World Rankings in effect 48 hours after the conclusion of the qualifying tournament.

If the qualifying tournament is not held, the additional eligible teams will complete the remaining quotas (up to a total of 8 teams) for the 2026 Central American and Caribbean Games by December 31, 2025.

The qualification period for the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026 runs from June 21, 2025, to April 21, 2026. The following qualification system must be followed:

- 1. Top 8 places in the qualification ranking for each weight class.
- 2. O1 place for each weight class directly assigned to the host country. **The athlete** must have participated in at least one event on the qualification circuit.
- 3. A maximum of one representative per country in each weight class.
- 4. The score will be assigned to the athlete and will not leave a place for the country (if they do not compete).
- 5. The three (03) best scores obtained from qualifying events will be considered. **The** athlete must have a minimum of 80 points to be considered eligible for qualification.

- d. If a tie persists, the highest score from one event will be considered, then, if required, the second-highest score, and so on, among their three best scores in qualifying events.
- e. If the athletes remain tied, the Executive Committee of the Pan American Judo Confederation will make the decision.
- 7. In the event that a spot cannot be reassigned within a weight class:
 - a. It will be reassigned to the athlete with the highest score within the gender (female or male) across all weight classes of the gender;
 - b. The athlete must have a minimum of 80 points to be eligible.
 - c. The NOC quota limits for each weight class must be met.
 - d. The tiebreaker system described in point 6 applies.

The top eight finishers in the 2025 Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026 will qualify for the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026, to be held in Panama City, Panama, from December 5–7, 2025.

As the Host Country, the Dominican Republic will qualify with a full team for the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026. However, the Dominican Republic will be required to present a representative in the weight division in which it intends to qualify at the 2025 Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026. For example, if the Dominican Republic wishes to qualify in the FS 57 kg category, an athlete from their country will have to participate in the 2025 Central American and Caribbean Qualifier to confirm their spot for the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026.

It should be noted that the athlete who attends the Qualifying Event may be different from the one who participates in the Games.

If, at the end of the Qualifying Event, the Dominican Republic fails to qualify in any weight division, only the top seven places will qualify, meaning the eighth spot will go to the host country.

Each NOC may register a maximum of one (1) athlete per category and weight class, if they meet the wrestling qualification criteria for the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026.

Athletes may only qualify in one style and weight class.

Wild cards

The United World Wrestling Americas (UWWA) will award six wild card spots to NOCs based on the NOC's universality principle, taking into account the following criteria:



2.6.1 RULES AND REGULATIONS

The rules of the 2026 CAC Games Squash competition will be established according to the conditions described in the following documents, which will be in force during the Games:

• Rule of Squash of the WS.

- The Regulations & Regulations, Code of Conduct of the World Squash, Centro Caribe Sports, 2026 CAC Games and PANAM SQUASH.
- If there are any doubts or disagreements regarding these rules, the English version shall prevail.
- Technical matters will be resolved according to the constitution and rules of the PANAM SQUASH. Ini accordance with the statute of Centro Caribe Sports, the technical committee of Centro Caribe Sports and the PANAM SQUASH will be responsible for the technical control and direction of the Squash competitions in 2026 CAC Games.

Protests and appeals

The procedure for hearing and resolving appeals will be applied as established by the PANAM SQUASH Appeals Panel for 2026 CAC Games.

Protests of a technical nature must be submitted in writing to the International Technical Delegate within two hours of the end of the match in question.

Protests must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 or its equivalent in the national currency. The decision of the Appeals Panel will be final and will be issued before the start of the next competition.

If a delegate wishes to protest the result of a match, they must lodge a written complaint to the International Technical Delegate. The Appeals Panel, which will decide on the matter. No appeal may be lodged against any decision based on the rules of squash, made by the referee of the match during the match.

To participate in the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026, athletes must comply with the provisions of the Games Regulations and the rules of the International Tennis Federation (ITF). They must also be registered by their National Olympic Committee (NOC) in accordance with the Statutes of Centro Caribe Sports (CCS).

MINIMUM PARTICIPATION

For an event or competition to be considered official, five (5) athletes must participate, as must the same number of National Olympic Committees.

If one or more teams, after the Technical Meeting, are unable to participate due to reasons of force majeure corroborated and verified by Centro Caribe Sports (CCS), which is the sole authority to authorize the event, Centro Caribe Sports will decide.

- Wild cards will be assigned by the COTECC Board of Directors. Applications must be submitted on the official form duly completed by the National Federation, no later than Friday, June 19, 2026, to the DTI, who will prepare the list and submit it to the COTECC Directors for selection.
- Each National Tennis Federation will send the names of its players to be entered into the Tennis competition to the International Technical Delegate (ITD) at direcciontecnicacotecc@hotmail.com no later than Monday, June 8, 2026, for the Acceptance List to be prepared. This Acceptance List will be published and sent to the Organizing Committee no later than Thursday, June 11, 2026, so that the NOCs can officially register the accepted players before the official deadline for nominal entries.

In the event of withdrawals or changes, substitute players will be chosen as followsa:

- 1. If the country that loses a player due to withdrawal has another unregistered player with a ranking level or, failing that, a WTN ranking (as of Monday, June 8, 2026) that allows them to be in the main draw of the designated event (singles and/or doubles), they may register them up until Monday, two weeks before the start of the singles draw.
- 2. After this time, substitutions will only be made using the alternate list.
- 3. If the country that loses a player due to withdrawal does not have a substitute with a ranking or WTN level that allows for direct acceptance, the next eligible player on the alternate list will take the available position.

4. The last time to make changes to player nominations PER EVENT, provided the Organizing Committee has officially registered the athlete, will be 36 hours before the Technical Congress, with the Competition Referee. It is the responsibility of each team's Delegate to contact the Competition Referee before this established time.

APPROVAL OF THE CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM

This classification system was reviewed and approved by COTECC and the ITF on May 9, 2025.

QUALIFICATION SYSTEM

Only NOCs recognized by Centro Caribe Sports as full or associate members and sports federations recognized by the Central American and Caribbean Shooting Confederation as full or associate members and that are in good standing with their membership may register athletes in qualifying events for the 2026 Central American and Caribbean Games.

1.4.1-In accordance with the figure approved for shooting by Centro Caribe Sports, 190 spots will be distributed under the following scheme:

- Athletes will receive up to 166 spots in three qualifying events.
- Twelve spots are reserved for the host country of the 2026 Central American and Caribbean Games, which will receive one spot in each event in which they have participated and did not qualify.
- 1.4.2.- The following are designated as QUALIFYING EVENTS FOR THE CENTRAL AMERICAN AND CARIBBEAN GAMES SANTO DOMINGO 2026:
 - The XXI CTCC Shotgun Championship, to be held in the city of Santo Domingo, DOM, from September 14 to 21, 2025 (4 qualifying events).
 - The XXI CTCC Rifle and Pistol Championship, to be held in the city of San Salvador, ESA, from September 25 to October 5, 2025 (8 qualifying events).
 - The XIII Central American Games, to be held in Guatemala City, from October 18 to 30, 2025, in the rifle, pistol, and shotgun categories. (12 qualifying events. (Only the Gold medal winner in each event receives a place).
- 1.4.3 The maximum number of places that a National Olympic Committee (NOC) can reach during all qualifying events will be as follows:
 - Men's Rifle: 5 athletes.
 - Women's Rifle: 5 athletes.
 - Men's Pistol: 6 athletes.
 - Women's Pistol: 5 athletes.
 - Men's Skeet: 3 athletes.
 - Women's Skeet: 2 athletes.
 - Men's Trap: 3 athletes.
 - Women's Trap: 2 athletes.

- 1.4.4 A NOC may only register a maximum of 3 athletes per event and gender in the qualifying event.
- 1.4.5 For a competition to be considered valid for the allocation of places, it must have the participation of athletes from 5 National Olympic Committees.
- If, for justified reasons duly verified by the Central American and Caribbean Shooting Confederation (CTCC), a registered NOC does not participate in the competition, it will be considered valid with 4 participating NOCs.
- 1.4.6 An athlete may only win one spot, which will go to their Federation.

PARTICIPATION SYSTEM

The competitions of the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026 will be held in accordance with the Centro Caribe Sports (CCS) Statute and the current International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) Regulations.

- 1.5.1 NOCs may participate individually and/or as teams in all events scheduled by Centro Caribe Sports at the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026, except for the Women's Trap and Skeet events, where only individual athletes will be allowed to participate.
- 1.5.2 Mixed teams are composed of athletes already qualified in Rifle, Pistol, and Shotgun. These teams will be composed of two athletes (one of each sex), and each NOC may enter up to two (2) teams in each mixed event.
- 1.5.3 An athlete who reaches the If a person has a place in a specific event, he or she may be registered and participate in the other event of his or her discipline. For example: 10m Air Rifle with 3 Positions Rifle and 10m Air Pistol with 25m Pistol.
- 1.5.4 There are no age restrictions for athletes participating in the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026.
- 1.5.5 Unforeseen cases will be resolved as follows:
 - Cases of a general nature will be resolved in accordance with the Statute of Centro Caribe Sports and the Regulations of the Central American and Caribbean Games.
 - Cases of a technical nature will be resolved in accordance with the established procedures of the CTCC and the General Regulations of the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF).
 - For an event to be considered official, a minimum of five (5) athletes and/or teams from an equal number of National Olympic Committees must participate, as established by the competition regulations of Centro Caribe Sports.
 - If one or more officially registered athletes and/or teams are unable to participate, participate due to force majeure or it is seen that they do not show up

to the competition with the intention of affecting one or more participating athletes or teams (duly verified by Centro Caribe Sports) the event will be held with athletes or teams from four (4) National Olympic Committees.

All athletes whose National Olympic Committees (NOCs) are recognized by Centro Caribe Sports as full or associate members, and those National Federations that are affiliated as full or associate members of the Central American and Caribbean Shooting Confederation (CTCC), may participate in the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026. CONFIRMATION OF QUOTA PLACES

Once the qualification process is complete, the places obtained by each NOC will be verified and confirmed by them on November 14, 2025.

REALLOCATION OF QUOTA PLACES

Depending on the number of participants (190 total), each NOC may register a maximum of 24 athletes distributed among the three (3) disciplines (Rifle, Pistol, and Shotgun), even if they have obtained a greater number of places in the qualifying events. NOCs WILL BE REQUIRED TO RETURN THE DIFFERENCE TO THE CTCC 15 BUSINESS DAYS PRIOR TO THE CLOSING OF NUMERICAL REGISTRATION for the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026, in order to redistribute them.

Undistributed or returned places will be allocated based on the following:

- To countries that participated and did not reach a quota and who request it in writing to the CTCC. These places will be distributed based on the best percentage placement in relation to the number of participants in each event.

The combination of athletes from different countries will not be permitted for the modalities and competitions scheduled for the Santo Domingo 2026 Central American and Caribbean Games.

NATIONALITY: Athletes participating in the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games Santo Domingo 2026 must have the nationality of the country they represent and the National Olympic Committee (NOC) that registered them. Competitor nationality is determined in accordance with the CCS Regulations.

CONFIRMATION OF QUOTA PLACES

NORCECA will confirm their qualifications to Centro Caribe Sport (CCS) and the NOCs by January 15, 2026.

The NOCs will confirm their qualifications to Centro Caribe Sport and NORCECA by January 25, 2026.

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

If necessary, NORCECA will confirm the reallocation of places no later than January 26, 2026.

NOCs that have received reallocated places must confirm their participation by January 31, 2026.
